From the Rector

What is God calling you to do and be?

That's a very short question with very long implications.

The end of August and the start of normal (?) routines at home and work and school always serve as opportunities to reflect on where we are and we want to be. And as part of the Body of Christ; as those who have been made and re-made in the image of God, part of that reflection, for us, must include God's plan for our lives.

By virtue of our Baptism into Christ's Body, each one of us has a ministry to fulfil in God's life, and in the life of His Church. Some of those ministries are very obviously leadership ministries; but the vast majority are every day ministries in which we live and serve as Christ's hands and eyes and ears and voice to a world which, at times, seems overwhelmed with sadness and grief and confusion.

For those of us here at St. Mary's what that ministry is will be answered in as many different ways as we have people willing to answer that call. Each ministry is as unique as you are. But what is common to all of us is this: God has a ministry for you. He leaves no one out!

Some of the ministries to which God is calling you may be one or more of the many things we're already doing here at St. Mary's, whether in our worship (singing, serving, reading, greeting, preparing); in our ministries to our younger members (Sunday School and Activity Days); in our Parish groups and programmes (Anglican Church Women, Mothers' Union; Bible Study; Pint of View; Parish Reception list); or one of the outreach ministries (Wednesday Hot Lunch, Tuesday Wheels to Meals, Community Garden) that we share in here at St. Mary's.

But others may be matters on your heart that we as a Parish should be challenged to pick up. If you can see something that needs to be done, please speak to me and I'd be very happy to work with you to see how we as a Parish might expand the outreach which we try to carry out in Christ's Name.

The possibilities are beyond count, but this much we know for sure: God is not calling us to stand still and leave the work to others. So, on this last Sunday in August, I end where I started: what is God calling you to do and be in the Body of Christ?

IN THE WATERS of baptism we are reminded that we are not born in a vacuum, nor do we journey entirely alone. Being reborn, being made alive, involves being born into a community.
