From the Rector

SOMETHING TO READ FOR LENT. As you will have seen in the notices, we have copies available of the book that the Bishop has recommended as personal reading for Lent. I've asked Carole-Ann McGee to share her reflections as she works through this excellent volume. She offers the following thoughts:

Liturgy of the Ordinary, written by Trish Harrison Warren is a book recommended by Bishop David Edwards and Fr Kevin as a Lenten read during our Lenten walk for the next forty days. Lent is a time to look deep into our souls, hearts and minds and truly examine our spiritual life. After having just read the first 60 pages, I was convinced the author had to have been following me and writing about my life. She writes quite candidly of her failings and her need to walk with Christ every 'Ordinary' day giving us an insight into our lives and how we can examine ourselves. The questions in the back of the book will help us look deep into ourselves. As I continue reading and taking my journey through the rest of the book, I pray that many will take this Lenten walk through the pages of this well written and spiritual book and may it be a blessing in your life.

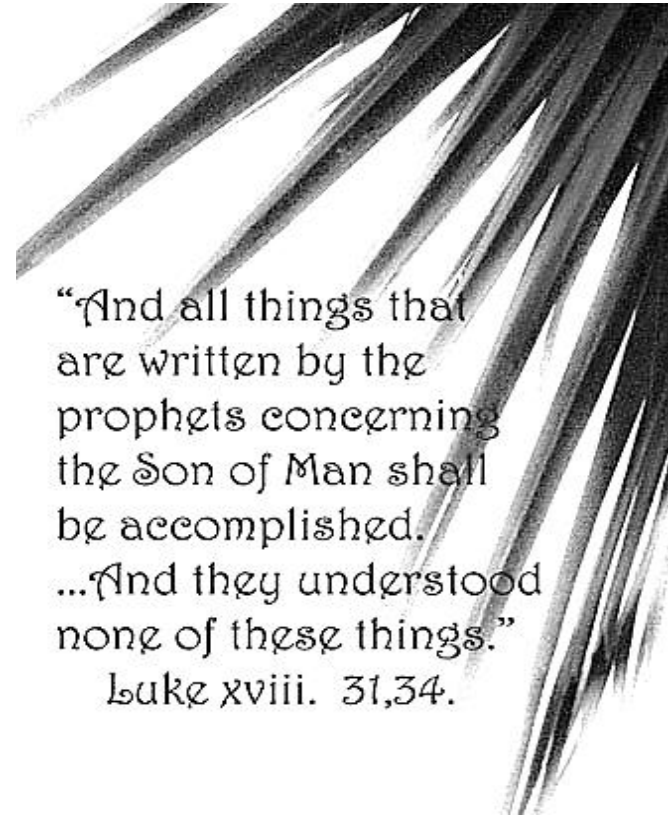
Every member of the Parish is encouraged to spend time during the Season of Lent in the traditional Lenten exercises: prayer, self-denial and fasting, self-examination, and reading and meditating on God's Word. Our Sunday morning discussion group in the Hall, our Wednesday evening Celebration of the Holy Eucharist, our Friday morning Bible Study, our Friday evening Stations of the Cross can all be 'taken on' as part of your Lenten discipline.
