From the Rector _____

Someone recently shared the following story with me. I thought that you might appreciate reading it as well:

It was a busy morning at the clinic, about 8:30, when a gentleman in his 80's arrived to have stitches removed from his thumb. He said that he was in a hurry because he had an appointment at 9:00 a.m. I took his vital signs and had him take a seat, knowing that it would be over an hour before someone would be able to see him. I saw him looking at his watch and decided, since I was not busy with another patient, that I would evaluate his wound. On exam, it was well healed, so I talked to one of the doctors, got the needed supplies to remove his sutures and redress his wound. While taking care of his wound, I asked him if he had another doctor's appointment this morning,

as he was in such a hurry. He told me no, that he needed to go to the nursing home to eat breakfast with his wife. I inquired as to her health. As we talked, I asked if she would be upset if he was a bit late. He replied that she no longer knew who he was, that she had not recognized him in three years now. I was surprised, and asked him, "And you still go every morning, even though she doesn't know who you are?" He smiled as he patted my hand and said: "She doesn't know me, but I still know who she is."

The love that God shares with us in Jesus Christ, and which he calls us to share with each other in Christ's Name, is not shared so that the giver might receive something back, not even something as simple as praise or glory. It's given freely because only love which is offered freely, without conditions or expectations, shares the nature of Grace. In what ways is Christ calling you to share that kind of love this week?
