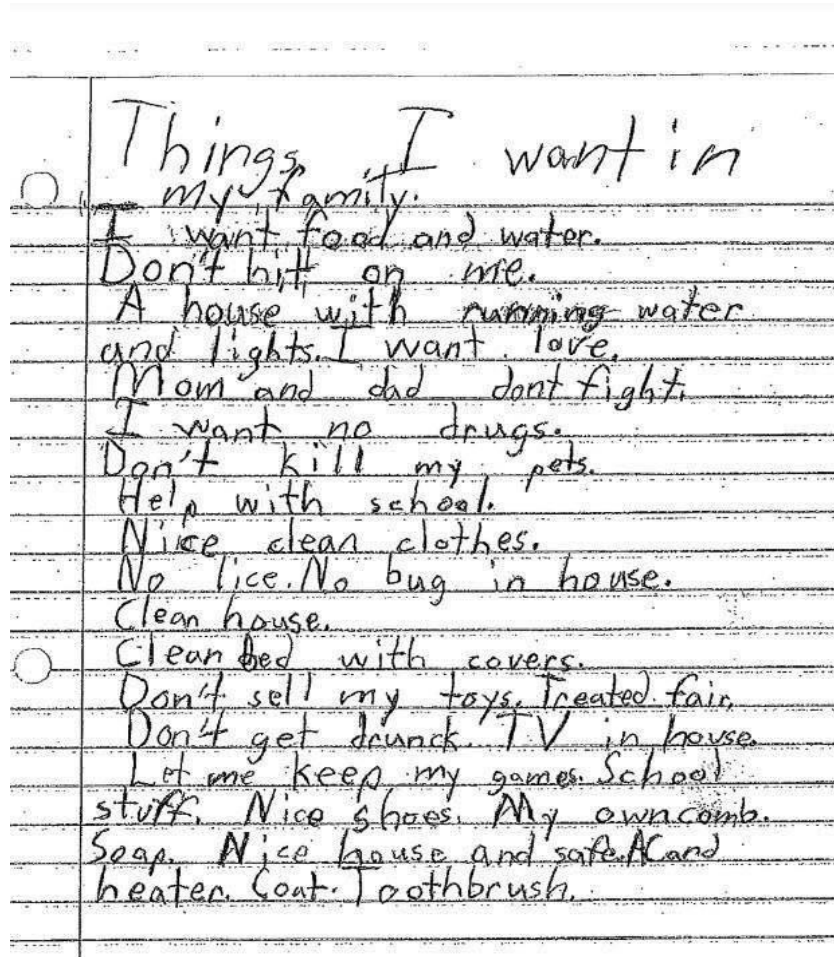
From the Rector _____
"How was your day?"

Maybe you say those few simple words all the time – after you get back home at the end of work or following whatever errands you had to run. And sometimes our days go well – without a hitch or frustration or complaint.

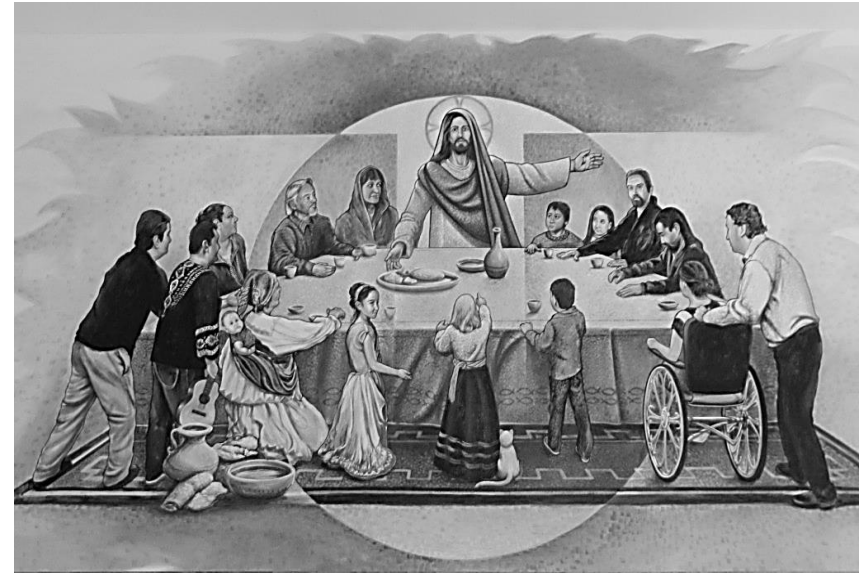
But sometimes things don't go the way we want. On rare occasions those complaints will be quite genuine – health or relationship matters are genuine threats to our peace and wellbeing. But most days our complaints are fairly mundane. It may be frustration with the way that someone has spoken to us or the behaviour of someone at the grocery store.

Sometimes I can get myself completely tied up because someone does something that annoys or frustrates me. And I'll vent about it – often to myself, sometimes to Janice. Hopefully, when I do, Janice will help me to see the larger picture – reminding me that in the overall scope of life, my life is pretty good; and that maybe I should try to let the little things go.

And sometimes, when I've struggled to see that larger picture, God sends me a message that helps me to step back. One example of that came this week, when I saw this on Twitter. It's said to be a note written by a child in the foster care system; a note about the kinds of things that he or she would like in a foster family; things that most of us take completely for granted. Maybe I should keep a copy of this around to look at whenever I start to get bent out of shape because of some little thing that someone has done. Maybe my life isn't so bad.

Christ, who said “Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you,” can truly say to every group of Christian friends “You have not chosen one another but I have chosen you for one another.” The Friendship is not a reward for our discrimination and good taste in finding one another out.
