From Archdeacon Cathy Laskey —

Thanks so much for your donation supporting me in the Coldest Night of the Year. What you did meant a lot to me personally - really! - but even more for the people in my community who need the support, help, and encouragement this money will provide. As of this week the \$30,000 Fredericton Goal has been met with \$32,172 donated with more to come in. Anglican Energy surpassed our goal and sit at \$3086! Good for second place! With your generous support, I was able to surpass my \$1000 goal by collecting \$1,361. Thank you all for giving and please keep praying for the event and for those who will benefit from your donation.

Youth in Transition has been working in the community for over 25 years addressing housing needs of homeless and at-risk youth between the ages of 16 – 19. With help from community members like you, they:

- . Provide safe and supportive housing for dozens of homeless youth each year
- . Help at-risk youth gain the social and personal supports required for independent living
- . Facilitate personal growth and life-skills training through in-house programs, and through positive role-modeling and mentorship
- . Conduct individualized case plans and refer residents to outside resources and community partners as needed

For individuals who have experienced homelessness, the pathway out of this cycle can be extremely challenging. In 2010, **the John Howard Society of Fredericton** completed construction of 12 new affordable housing units specifically designated to house chronically and episodically homeless individuals. While this project has been incredible successful (seeing an 83% reduction in emergency and institutional service use, such as, police, ambulance, hospital, justice system interventions, etc...) As of 2017 they have grown to 20 affordable housing units and have started constructing an additional four units opening in early 2019.
