From the Rector ———

I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth.

1 Corinthians 3:6

On the table in the narthex you will find letters from the Parish Corporation regarding the proposed Renewing St. Mary's Renovation Project. (If you are unable to locate an envelope with your name please let me know and I will see that you get a copy.) As has been reported at the last two Annual

Meetings, as well as the Parish presentation in January, the project represents conversations over the last decade and more regarding a number of issues about our facility that pose threats to the long-term ability of St. Mary's to serve Christ and the community. Some of these issues are core issues that impinge on the safe use of our building; other issues are related matters that diminish our effective use of the facility. All of the issues addressed by the design concept that the Parish Corporation commissioned in 2018 are in some ways interwoven, so that what began as simple conversations about a number of different issues has merged into a large project that seeks to address all of these issues as efficiently as possible.

In one way or another all of these issues relate to some very basic questions that everyone here at St. Mary's needs to be asking themselves: what do we see as St. Mary's mission; and how do we plan to carry out that mission in the future? Or, why has God put us here and what is He asking us to do with the gifts that He has given us? Or, in other words, how do we see ourselves ministering not just to our congregation and those on our Parish list but also to the wider community, including those who do not understand themselves to be members of the Parish? And how can we renew our Church and Hall, which date back 40 and 50 years respectively, to ensure that we can carry out that mission for the next generation or more?

If you believe that St. Mary's has a mission into the future, as I do, we'll need to do some things to resolve the deficiencies which have been identified; and to resolve them efficiently will require hard work and sacrifice and courage. This week's letter seeks your prayerful and financial support for the project. The members of the Parish Corporation want to assure you that we're very grateful for the regular support which you give week after week and year after year to provide for the Parish's ministry. We also recognise that each person's situation is unique: how you will be able to support this essential project will vary depending on all of the other demands for your time, talent, and treasure. Some may be in a position to make significant contributions immediately in a way that allows us to reduce the amount that we need to borrow; others may be able to make small increases to their weekly or monthly support that will give us the means of paying off our loans as quickly as possible. Some may be able to do a contribution of those two options.

Regardless of what your resources may be, we invite you to share in this important Parish renewal project. Years ago the people of this Parish had a vision for the Church's mission in this place; they built knowing that the primary beneficiaries of their hard work and sacrifice would be the unknown generations who would follow them. Like St. Paul, they planted a seed that others would water, knowing all long, even if they could not see the future, that God would give the growth. Now that task has come to us. I pray for your help to make this happen, in God's Name.
